



**MINUTES

Chairman Harry Berry called the meeting to order at approximately 10:02 a.m.

The first agenda item was approval of the minutes from the February 24, 2017 meeting of the Policy Committee. Mayor Ronnie Joyner made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Mayor Edna Berger. Motion carried.

The second agenda item was a review and approval of the MPO's FY 2018 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Mr. Mike Skaggs provided the committee with an overview of the FY 2018 UPWP including the major work tasks, budget, and local match requirements. Following review, Mayor Ronnie Joyner made a motion to approve the FY 2018 UPWP, seconded by Mayor Edna Berger, motion carried.

The third agenda item was a review of proposed scoring criteria for the MPO to utilize for adding points to highway projects as part of the KYTC Strategic Highway Investment Formula for Tomorrow (SHIFT) process. The proposed criteria are shown below. The

criteria have been developed and recommended by the MPO Technical Advisory Committee (TAC).

Following review and discussion, Judge Harry Berry made a motion to approve the criteria as proposed by the MPO TAC, the motion was seconded by Mayor Ronnie Joyner, motion carried.

The fourth agenda item was a District 4 project update. The following projects were discussed:

- KY 251 – moved to 2018 for right-of-way letting
- US 62 – bridge near Stephensburg – has been let
- I-65 pavement rehab project – late spring/early summer
- Cardinal Drive – right-of-way being purchased now, bid March 2018
- KY 361/Deckard School Road – will begin when asphalt plants open
- KY 1600 – pre-construction meeting next week
- I-65 – complete by end of 2017
- KY 313 – signal at 1638 – April 20 – complete by summer
- Resurfacing – Brandenburg – Main Street to Ohio River – on hold
- Resurfacing – US 31W – from KY 313 south to E'town has started
- KY 79 – on hold
- PAUSE 50 – July 1 - \$50 million available for projects – which projects is not known yet

- St. John Road – still on hold – additional funding is needed
- US 31W access management – left turn at Aldi / Centennial Drive cut off

Next, Chairman Berry called for public comments. No public comments were made.

Chairman Berry then asked if there was any other business that needed to be discussed. No other business was brought forward.

With no other business to come before the committee, the meeting adjourned at approximately 10:35 a.m.
