Chairman Harry Berry called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

The first agenda item was consideration of the minutes from the July 12, 2022. Mayor Ronnie Joyner made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Mayor Jeff Gregory. Motion carried.

The second agenda item was review and approval to support KYTC's 2023 Safety Targets. The targets were set by KYTC as follows: Fatalities – 764; Fatality Rate/100 M VMT – 1.575; Serious Injuries – 2,658; Serious Injury Rate/100 M VMT – 5.519; and Non-Motorized Fatalities & Serious Injuries – 289. Mr. Isidro Delgado made a motion to approve the MPO's support of KYTC's 2023 Safety Targets, second by Mayor Gregory, motion carried.

The third agenda item was Amendment #3 to the MPO Transportation Improvement program (TIP). The amendment adds new projects to the Federally-funded portion of the TIP and adjusts project information to comply with the KYTC Highway Plan. Mr. Mike Skaggs presented the new projects to the Policy Committee. Following review, Judge Leslie Stith made the motion to approve TIP Amendment #3, second by Mr. Jim Bradford, motion carried.

The fourth agenda item was a review of the FY 2022 Performance & Expenditure Report. Mr. Skaggs covered the major accomplishments and expenditures of the MPO from the previous fiscal year. The P&E report was for information purposes and required no committee action.

The fifth agenda item was approval of new MPO Policy Committee Officers for 2023. Mayor Jeff Gregory was nominated for Chairman beginning in January 2023 and Judge Leslie Stith if he for Vice-Chairman. Mayor Ronnie Joyner made a motion to approve these nominations, second by Chairman Berry, motion carried.

- (4-20.01) I-65 Interchange at KY 222 in Glendale – Let January 2022 – Scotty’s
- (4-9011.10) – HSIP Intersection Emphasis - US 31W @ KY 1136 - Let January 2022 – 10/1 Completion – Probably start in August
- (4-9011.30) – HSIP Intersection Emphasis – Dual Lefts on KY361 @ Ring Rd. - Let January 2022 – 10/1 Completion – Surveying, probably start in August
- (4-9011.40) – HSIP Intersection Emphasis - US 31W @ Elm Road – D4 Traffic to make minor signal improvements - Complete

- (4-153.01) KY 251 improvements – AEI – Relocating Utilities – No letting date set
- (4-171.00) KY 1136 from KY 1868 to US 31W – In Design – D,R,U,C in Biennium – Public Meeting 8/18, PL&G early September
- (4-198.00) Ring Road extension – D Funds Authorized – R,U in Biennium – Public Meeting August or early September
- (4-286.10) I-65 Weigh Station – D,R in Biennium - finalizing site layout and working with Finance Cabinet on building and KTC on weigh station equipment.
- (4-8801.00) KY 1357 widening – WMB – Moving Utilities – Oct. 2022 Letting
- Combined ALL of these remaining roundabouts into a single group letting in July 2022 in hopes of getting awardable bids, with a 2023 completion date for all

- (4-8702.00) KY 79 from KY 477 to KY 144 – R is State Funded in Biennium - Going to wrap up design

- (4-8705.00) KY 79 from KY 144 to KY 313 – Burgess & Niple – Beginning R/W – D,R is State funded in Biennium - R/W informational meeting last month, take ~1 year to buy ROW, wait until next highway plan for U and D
- (4-9011.20) HSIP Intersection Emphasis – US 31W @ KY 1638 – Let June 2022 – No bids

Next, Chairman Berry called for public comments. No public comments were brought forth.

Chairman Berry then asked if there was any Other Business that needed to be discussed. Mr. Skaggs shared appreciation for both Judge Berry and Mayor Joyner for their dedication and service to the MPO.
