Chairman Jeff Gregory called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

The first agenda item was consideration of the minutes from the January 26, 2023 meeting. Judge Troy Kok made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Judge Keith Taul. Motion carried.

Chairman Jeff Gregory then recognized and welcomed Senator Matt Deneen.

The second agenda item was review and approval of the FY 2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Mr. Mike Skaggs provided a brief overview of the work program. Following discussion, Judge Kok made a motion to approve the work program. The motion was seconded by Judge Taul. Motion carried.

The third agenda item was review and approval of Project Sponsorships for Strategic Highway Investment Formula for Tomorrow (SHIFT) 2024. Mr. Skaggs presented the eleven (11) projects selected by the MPO Technical Advisory Committee for sponsorship. The committee reviewed the list and discussed a few projects including the reconstruction of US 31W in West Point and improvements in the Glendale area, and KY 313 in Meade County. Following discussion, Mayor Bryan Claycomb made a motion to approve the sponsorships as presented. The motion was seconded by Judge Kok. Motion carried. The list of sponsored projects is below:
